THE SENSITIVITY OF AN ESG ISSUE TO INGENIA AND TO ITS STAKEHOLDERS, IN TERMS OF IMPORTANCE, FORMS THE BASIS OF MATERIALITY ANALYSIS, WHICH IN TURN GUIDES THE PROCESSES FOR IDENTIFYING, MANAGING, AND DEVISING SPECIFIC ACTION PLANS FOR ADDRESSING OUR MATERIAL ISSUES.

Material issues are defined as those that are important to our stakeholders and have the greatest impact on Ingenia's business and our ability to create value.

Our Materiality Assessment is designed to guide and support:

- · Effective risk management
- Regulatory compliance
- Stakeholder trust and engagement
- Sustainable, long-term value creation.

We consider financial materiality as well as environmental and social impact materiality when considering reputation and what is important to our stakeholders.

An annual review of the Group's material issues is undertaken to ensure that emerging issues and stakeholder objectives and focus are regularly assessed and inform our reporting. Topics emerging outside of the formal annual review are also assessed for materiality and considered in our sustainability strategy, ensuring our strategy remains relevant and responsive to changing stakeholder expectations and business context.

In FY25, following the establishment of the Group's refreshed business strategy and a clear 1-, 3- and 5-Year Plan, we undertook a more detailed review and updated our material issues to comprehensively evaluate ESG issues, encompass stakeholder input, industry trends, and ensure alignment with refined organisational goals. This process also considered alignment with the Group's revised Purpose and Values, progress in relation to ESG actions and the Group's business operations, and current asset portfolio.

### This process involved:

- Research: Analysing internal and external insights, stakeholder feedback and benchmarking against peers and ESG frameworks
- Engagement: Workshops and targeted consultations with stakeholders to gather diverse perspectives
- Prioritisation: Executive and leadership team members participated in a structured workshop which included representation across the business to evaluate material matters and prioritise them in terms of their importance to stakeholders and their impact on the business
- Activation and Disclosure: Embedding into strategy, operations and disclosures.

Stakeholder perspectives included:

- Investor feedback
- Resident and guest satisfaction surveys and feedback
- Employee engagement surveys and feedback via other forums
- Industry-specific trends, including regulatory and political developments
- Industry engagement and advocacy
- Community engagement
- Media (including social media).

Ingenia's Group Executive and internal ESG committee, which includes relevant executives and members of their senior leadership teams, played a key role in the review, identification and prioritisation of material issues. These material issues and associated disclosures were then approved by the Group Executive and Board.

Ingenia identified the following material issues across the business and a consolidated outcome of the stakeholder engagement process to help determine a set of core material issues, as shown in the table below.

Each of these material issues are addressed in our disclosures.

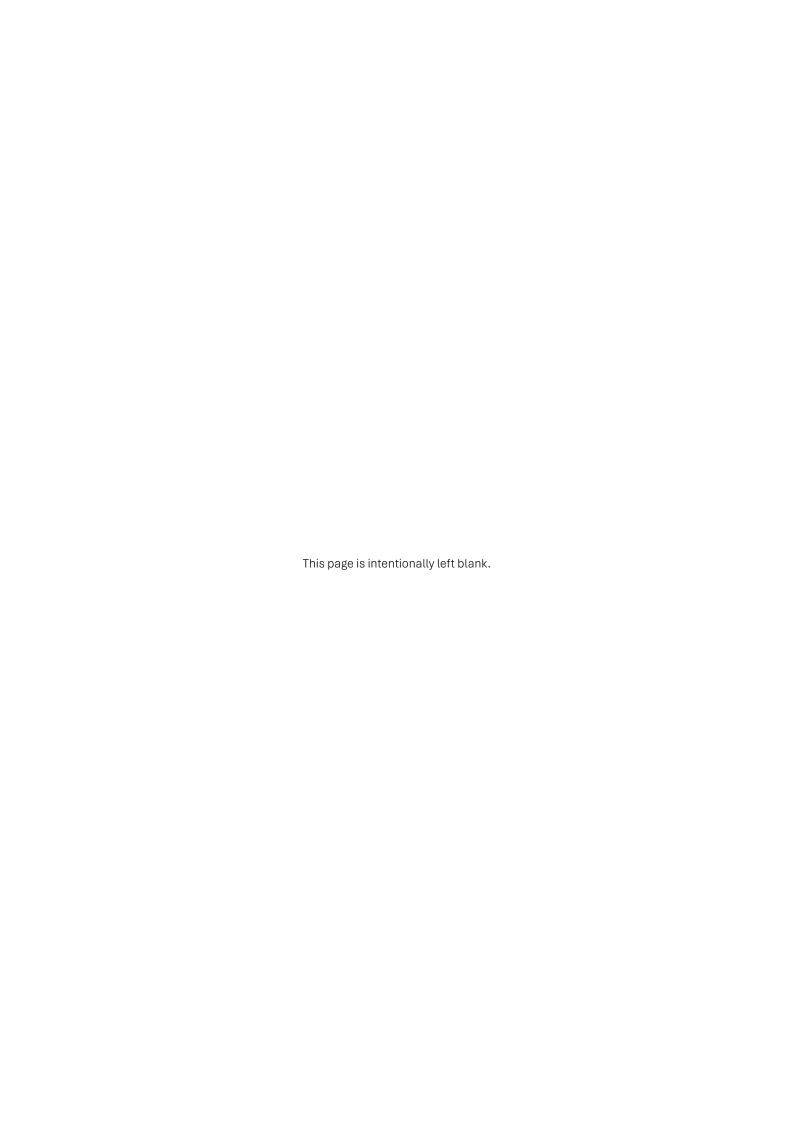
